Adams Funeral Set for Thursday Morning

LITTLE ROCK, ARK. – Funeral arrangements have been set for Chris Adams, 25, a Forest Ranger (firefighter) in Lafayette County, killed Monday morning in a rollover accident while driving an Arkansas Forestry Commission 2002 International tractor trailer.

Services will be 10 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 5, at Bradley Baptist Church in Bradley. Visitation will be 3 to 8 p.m. tonight at Smith Funeral Home Chapel in Bradley.

The accident occurred on Highway 360, approximately one-half mile east of Highway 29 near Canfield, while Adams was en route to check on a fire from earlier in the morning. The cause of the accident is undetermined.

The Forestry Commission hired Adams in February 2008. He also was employed by Brackman Farms, and served as a Bradley Auxiliary Police Officer and a volunteer firefighter for River Bend Fire Department. Adams was an Eagle Scout, a member of Bradley Baptist Church and a Little League Baseball Dugout Dad.

He is survived by his parents, Raymond and Linda Adams of Bradley; brother, Ray Adams and sister-in-law, Tonya, of Springhill, La; brother, Eddie Adams of Bradley; sister, Mary Adams of Maud, Texas; nieces, Jordan Griffin and Catherine Smith and nephew, Lane Henderson; and numerous other relatives and friends.
