AFC Crews working across Northern Arkansas to clear ice storm debris

LITTLE ROCK, ARK. – The Arkansas Forestry Commission has been working closely with community leaders, fire departments and emergency personnel across the state to clear roadway areas hard hit by this week's ice storm.

AFC chainsaw and dozer crews worked in the following areas:

- Two AFC Rangers from Forrest City used dozers to aid with piling debris brought to the Craighead County landfill.
- Two AFC Rangers from Jonesboro worked to clear roadways to get school bus routes open in Clay County.
- A chainsaw strike team from the Malvern area cleared roads in and around Eureka Springs.
- Two Washington County Rangers cleared a site to be used by the county to bring debris. Other Washington personnel worked to clean up around their office.
- Benton and Madison County Rangers were clearing debris in Madison County.
- Sharp, Fulton and Randolph Rangers assisted in storm damage cleanup in their counties; and
- Lawrence County Rangers cleared roads to a building where volunteers will stay while assisting with cleanup efforts.
