## **AFC Crews working across Northern Arkansas to clear ice storm debris**

**LITTLE ROCK, ARK.** – The Arkansas Forestry Commission has been working closely with community leaders, fire departments and emergency personnel across the state to assist in areas hard hit by last week's ice storm.

- AFC chainsaw and dozer crews provided assistance in the following areas:
- On Wednesday, two Newton County rangers picked up three generators at Greenbrier, and delivered them to Compton, Welcome Home and Mt. Judea.
- Two rangers in Marion County cleaned out roads today in their county.
- Two rangers from Benton County worked in eastern Benton County and northern Madison County.
- Rangers from Boone County worked to clean up damage around the AFC's Harrison office.
- Two rangers from Jonesboro assisted in Clay County.
